Region News

Six members of our chapter, Esther Beck, Shari Dym, Robin Rosenthal, Luisa Narins, Kellie Portman and Laura Monaco attended an interesting and informative region meeting last month. We enjoyed the company of members from other region chapters, heard from two wonderful presenters, and had a delicious lunch. As an added benefit, on the way home we shopped at Seven Mile Kosher Market for Passover goodies. The weather was beautiful and carpooling made the trip all the more enjoyable. Two of our members went the night before and took advantage of the spa facilities.

The first presenter was Professor Claire Simmons is a Melton Program Master Lecturer, one of the founding teachers of the Upper School of the Charles E. Smith Jewish Day School and chair of the Jewish History Department. She established the Hebrew Language Department at American University. She currently leads Jewish themed tours of countries in Europe, Asia and North Africa. The title of her presentation was “The Mystery of the Jewish Knapsack”. She spoke extensively on the history of the Jewish people and how they were able to survive over the millennia in the Diaspora. In her words, “Jewish survival is an anomaly not a given”. She listed the reasons that Jews were able to survive because of all the things we carried in our proverbial knapsacks in every century. That knapsack was filled with the Torah, ethics, religion, morals, justice, philosophy, and the law. This certainly does not do justice to this well organized and beautifully presented discussion, but is merely a snapshot of the quality of programs presented at the Region meetings.

The second speaker, Samantha Abrams Gilmore, founder of All Over Wellness, and a Certified Holistic Health and Nutrition Counselor, talked about the “Sugar Blues.” We learned how sugar impacts our lives in so many ways that can harm our and our children's health. She highlighted issues that most people were not aware of when we consume everyday foods that contain unhealthy forms of sweetener. However, she did also provide the participants with healthy alternative natural sweeteners, such as agave nectar, barley malt, honey, Stevia in the green or brown form, and Sucanat.

Both of these presenters stimulated lots of good discussions and there was plenty of time for questions. **If this sounds like fun, join us at the next Region meeting in Reston Virginia on May 2, 2010 Connections with Israel and the U.S.**

The Greening of the American Jewish Home

Rabbi Nina Beth Cardin

On Wednesday, March 10, 2010, Harrisburg Hadassah, in partnership with the Jewish Federation's Hazon Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program hosted Rabbi Nina Beth Cardin. Rabbi Cardin is a past General Consultant for the Coalition on Environment and Jewish Life (COEJL) and currently the Director of the Baltimore Jewish Environmental Network. She spoke to our Hadassah members, and members of our community at large, about making Harrisburg's Jewish Community healthier and more sustainable for everyone.

Prior to her presentation, Bruce Weber and Dickenson Professor Ted Merwin introduced the Hazon (CSA) program. The CSA is an organic, locally grown effort to provide the Jewish community with an alternative to purchasing produce. The concept requires purchasing shares either full for a family of four, or half. The shares must be prepaid and there has to be a minimum of 20 full shares purchased. Rabbi Cardin stated that CSA puts people in touch with the harmony and cycles of nature. She explained that this experience teaches us to live with both the abundance and limits of nature. According to her, people have become a geophysical force just like weather and other occurrences of nature. Therefore, we have a special ethical imperative to live wisely and sustainably so as not to destroy the self-healing and self-renewing capacity of the earth.

To reinforce her statement, she referenced two texts by Rabbi Samson Raphael Hirsch, from his master work, Horeb. Both texts speak directly about our obligation to protect and preserve the environment. "God has given creation to you freely for your appropriation, for your benefit. Have regard for this creation when it serves not you, but the cosmic purpose." "Do not destroy anything." Rabbi Cardin suggests that we can also view nature, that is creation, as another sort of sacred text,. She further stated that every culture sees text through their own lens.

Rabbi Cardin expanded her explanation of nature to include the corporate/industrial view of nature as resources such as mining, lumber, fishing etc. Once industry and corporations harvest and process these resources the byproducts are dumped back into nature. She explained that the last day of the Creation is the creation of man, "humanity." The first blessing in Judaism is a mandate to protect the environment. In the second chapter of Genesis, Adam was created to till the earth and to preserve it.

Nature does not waste, it recycles, for example, fallen leaves and trees, rain goes into waterways, and hence waste should not be created by man. Rabbi Cardin said there should be two ways to recycle. First should be according to the ways of nature. Second, everything that cannot be recycled naturally should be recycled back into industry, for example, recycling electronics.

In conclusion, Rabbi Cardin stated that Hadassah with it's 300,000 members has the power to change the way we live and ensure sustainability and we can do it locally.

NEW \$1,000,000 CHALLENGE GRANT

A new \$1,000,000 challenge grant was announced by a generous donor at the January 14, 2010 Society of Major Donors Reunion in Boca Raton, Florida. This extraordinary gift will be matched dollar for dollar with gifts beginning at the Centennial Founders level of \$25,000 and above, payable up to five years, until the \$1,000,000 goal is reached or announced at the Founders Dinner at Hadassah's National Convention, Monday, July 26, 2010. To date, more than \$286,000 has been raised toward this exciting new challenge gift. All donors making major gifts qualifying for the challenge will be eligible for individual recognition, according to the level of gift and naming opportunity selected. Pledges and donations must be made between January 14, 2010 and July 26, 2010.

Tower Challenge Grant gifts should be submitted under Giving Program Code "C01G" on the Remittance Form.

50 Years Ago...

AT HADASSAH

"Life Membership Tells of Tie to Medical Endowment Fund", reads a headline in the March, 1960 issue of Hadassah Headlines. The article continues, "The Life Membership Fund symbolizes the unbreakable bond between Hadassah and those members enrolled for life. Now, a new fund has been set up - the Hadassah Medical Endowment Fund - for which monies come from that part of Life Membership not used to safeguard our administration both nationally and locally."

Life Membership began in 1949, after the successful completion of a pilot program run by the Boston Chapter. By 1960, as Hadassah planned and raised funds for the new Medical Center at Ein Kerem, the funds from new life memberships were being used to help finance the building through the establishment of an endowment fund. The article continues:

"As our decision to create the Fund radiates throughout the country, women will be pleased to know that in becoming Life Members they serve in two ways: through the proud lifetime affiliation with our organization, and in perpetuity because Life Membership money will be used to further our lifesaving work in Israel."

Feta-Spinach Salmon Roast

- 1 12 oz container of whipped cream cheese
- 2 6 oz containers of crumbled feta cheese
- 3 scallions, thinly sliced including the greens
- 2 packed cups fresh spinach, chopped
- 1 2-3 lb fillet of skinless salmon
- Olive oil for brushing salmon and feta mixture
- Garnish with lemon rounds and lemon wedges for serving
- 2 small shallow baking pans

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees

Combine the cream cheese and feta, mashing and stirring with a fork until well blended. Add scallions and spinach, combine well, drizzle olive oil to help

the mix become homogeneous. Place in small shallow baking pan and spread out to cover entire pan. Brush both sides of one salmon fillet with olive oil and place in a shallow baking pan. Arrange lemon rounds over salmon.

Put both pans in the oven and bake for 30-45 minutes until salmon is done.

Let stand for a few minutes before cutting and serving.

Serve with lemon wedges on the side.



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Yahrzeits

In the beauty of the Jewish tradition, we are taught to remember our loved ones with acts of charity and loving-kindness. Hadassah provides the opportunity to memorialize a loved one on the Yahrzeit (date of death) within the sanctity of the synagogue housing the magnificent Mark Chagall stained glass windows at the Hadassah Medical Center in Jerusalem. For a one-time payment of \$1,000, your loved one's name will be inscribed in a Yahrzeit Memorial book and a certificate will be issued to you. Each year notification of the Yahrzeit date is mailed, in advance, from Israel as a reminder of the observance. On the Yahrzeit day, the name is recited in the Kaddish prayer in the synagogue.
